**Re: City of Coquitlam (the “City”) Application for Reconsideration and Variance of Order G-80-19 in the matter of the FortisBC Energy Inc. (“FEI”) Application for Use of Lands under Sections 32 and 33 of the Utilities Commission Act in the City for the Lower Mainland Intermediate Pressure System Upgrade Projects Project No. 1599008**

While we are very reluctant to provide additional submissions after the filing of reply, we feel it is important in this instance since the City has mischaracterized FEI’s position materially.

At paragraph 15 (on page 6) of its Reply Argument, the City states:

...in paragraph 24 of its final argument FEI seems to be proposing that the BCUC rescind the term of Order G-80-19 that upon request by the City in circumstances where it interferes with municipal infrastructure FEI shall remove segments of NPS 20 pipes. [Emphasis in original.]

Nowhere in the referenced paragraph does FEI indicate that any of Order G-80-19 should be rescinded. FEI’s position has not been that Order G-80-19 should be rescinded; it has been that the BCUC should uphold its cost allocation order in paragraph 2 of BCUC Order G-80-19 as being in the public interest.
