- 1 Indigenous-led Assessment that TWN will undertake and a process to seek consensus with TWN,
- 2 which are described in the Assessment Plan.
- 3 The remainder of this response is redacted and is being filed on a confidential basis, pursuant to
- Section 19 of the BCUC's Rules of Practice and Procedure regarding confidential documents as 4
- 5 set out in Order G-178-22, as it contains commercially sensitive information. The information is
- 6 of a commercially sensitive nature and significant harm or prejudice to FEI's competitive or
- 7 negotiating position is reasonably expected to result if the confidential information was made
- 8 public.
- 9 Musqueam Indian Band (Musqueam) is also undertaking an Indigenous-led Assessment for the
- 10 Phase 2 LNG Expansion Project. Moreover, in June 2022, FortisBC Holdings Inc. and Musqueam
- 11 reached an agreement that will allow for collaboration and partnership between Musqueam and
- 12 FortisBC related to the BCUC-regulated and non-BCUC regulated projects at Tilbury
- 13 Island. While the specific details of the agreement are confidential, the agreement includes,
- 14 among other things, options for Musqueam to acquire equity ownership in the forward regulated
- 15 projects including the TLSE Project, subject to applicable regulatory approvals (which would
- 16 include BCUC approval) and other conditions. This agreement is in addition to the project
- 17 mitigations that have been or will be implemented as part of regulatory processes.
