





Your home's energy use

Where do you think you use the most energy in your home? Space and water heating take up the biggest amount—more than 75 per cent. Lighting only takes about five per cent.



What's your home's energy mix?

The energy to run your home can come from a variety of sources. For example, a water heater could use natural gas or electricity. A fireplace could be electric or fuelled by wood or natural gas. Most appliances and all electronics run on electricity.

Save on space heating

50%

No cost

- wear a sweater instead of turning up the heat
- turn heat down to 17 °C or lower at night and when out, and no higher than 20 °C when home and awake
- keep doors and windows shut

Low cost

- weatherstrip exterior doors and windows that open
- caulk around window trim and inoperable window frames
- install a programmable or smart thermostat
- replace furnace filter every three months

Save hot water

26%

No cost

- fix leaky faucets
- shorten showers by one to three minutes
- wash laundry in cold water

Low cost

- replace old showerheads with water-efficient models
- install water-efficient faucet aerators
- insulate water supply pipes in unheated spaces
