LIGHTING OF THE 2010 OLYMPIC CAULDRON TO HONOUR TEAM CANADA COMPETING IN PYEONGCHANG

Vancouver, BC (February 8, 2018) – To honour both the athletes representing Canada on the world's biggest sports stage and the 2018 host city PyeongChang, South Korea, the Vancouver Convention Centre will light the iconic Vancouver 2010 Cauldron on Thursday, February 8 prior to the Opening Ceremony for the Olympic Games and Saturday, March 17 prior to the Closing Ceremony for the Paralympic Games.

The public is invited to Jack Poole Plaza to see the lightings of the Cauldron and to wear red and white to show support for Canada's athletes competing in the 2018 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games.

In addition, BC Pavilion Corporation (PavCo) will show support and pride for Team Canada by lighting its venues in Canada's colours:

- At the <u>Vancouver Convention Centre</u>, the Cauldron and facility district markers will glow red and white for the duration 2018 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games.*
- <u>BC Place</u> will glow in red on select days and feature a unique "Medal Ceremony" animation during opening and closing days and when Team Canada wins a medal.*

*with the exception of scheduled illuminations for events and community organizations

- There will be a brief celebration and remarks by the Honourable Lisa Beare, Minister Tourism, Arts and Culture, Brent Hayden, Olympic Medalist and World Champion and Ken Cretney, PavCo President and CEO at 5:00 p.m.

Saturday, March 17:

- 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in advance of the Closing Ceremony for the 2018 Paralympic Games.
